A Brand New Season

Anticipated growth yields 3 new tournaments for 2011 schedule

The Mulligan Tour LLC, Belleville, MI -

Onward and upward. The Mulligan Tour is starting the 2011 season with 80+ members and will conduct a record number of tournaments in it's 13th season.

Membership may not reach the record 89 members of the 2010 season but the Tour added 3 new tournaments anticipating growth. The Tour will conduct 43 events in 2011 starting with the Qualifying Schools in mid April and ending with the Runny Nose Open in November.

The Tour's regular season starts on April 30th with the Pine View Classic, a West Division tournament, and the Tin Cup, a Central Division event. The East Division gets started a week later at Blackheath GC with the Sweet Sixteen tournament.

Generally, each regional division will conduct 2 or 3 tournaments each month before breaking for one of the Tour's major championships.

In all, the Tour's Central Division will conduct 10 tournaments including the PLAYERS Championship for those players finishing in the top-20 on the Central money list. The West Division will also hold 10 tournaments, including the WESTERN Championship for the top-20 money winners, and the 2-year old East Division has a schedule of 9 tournaments culminating in the EASTERN Championship for the top-20 East money winners.

Among the new tournaments on the 2011 schedule, the East Division will unveil the Cherry Creek Classic on June 4th and the East Side Charity Classic on July 23rd. The other new tournament to debut in 2011 is the UPS Store Golf Classic scheduled for August 21 at Northville Hills GC on the Central schedule.

The UPS Store sponsored the Quad-Tour Challenge in 2009 and 2010, but will launch a new tournament for 2011.

Other returning title sponsors include Victor McCoy's Real McCoy Classic and Karl Carter's Dudlee's Plymouth Open. Farmington Hills GC will host the Real McCoy for the 6th year in a row and Fox Hills is the host course for the Dudlee's.

Dan Schwartz's Commercial Underwriter's Risk Management has been the title sponsor for the Harbour Pointe Open since 2001.

Later in the season. Tour member Jason Rectenwald continues to sponsor the Carrington Classic while the consortium of Tom & Barb Hoelzle, Dick Spiers and Denny Ersig bring the Fifty Cent Classic back to **2011 Schedule Highlights**

Rules meant to be Broken

USGA rules just don't make sense for the recreational golfer

Articles in Golf Digest and Golf World magazines this past winter made me chuckle when they detailed some of the ridiculous golf rules that the pros must abide.

I suppose golf is their profession and most of them make very good money for playing a game. Still, some of these rules seem a bit arcane for the recreational golfer.

Among some of the silliest rules violations last year:

Ian Poulter, Dubai World Championship - Penalized a stroke when his ball marker moved when he dropped his ball on it.

Dustin Johnson, PGA Championship - Penalized for grounding his club in a "bunker" in which spectators were allowed to walk.

Juli Inkster, Safeway Classic - Disqualified after the 2nd round

when officials discovered that she used a weighted practice aid on one of her clubs trying to stay loose during a back-up on the 10th hole.

Of these occurrences, none would be infractions on the Mulligan Tour.

Some things are just too trivial for me. I have seen and heard about Mulligan Tour players just brushing the sand on the takeaway of a bunker shot. Or about the player that marks his/her ball on the green and then does not bring the ball back to the same position. Some players seem to move their ball forward a half inch after marking.

But does anyone really think there is an advantage in lightly touching the sand in the bunker or having a 21' 8" putt verses a 21' 8½" putt?

The Mulligan Tour has rules - rules that are needed to keep the field level for all competitors, but let's not sweat the small stuff. Life is too short and rule #1 is to "have fun".

A few USGA Rules NOT followed by <u>the Mulligan Tour</u>

1) Stroke and distance for OB or lost ball

(Yeah right, let's back everything up on Saturday morning!)

2) Play it as it lies

(Sorry, we don't get paid hundred of thousands of dollars to hit out of fairway divots)

3) Cannot repair spike marks on greens

(Really? That's part of the game - putting through defects??)

4) No mulligans

(A golf league called the "Mulligan Tour" must have a mulligan)

Other season highlights:

• The season's first grand slam event - the Memorial Tournament invites teams of 2 to Gateway GC to battle for the Green Towels. The tournament will be played for the 17th time on May 21st.

• The Majestic at Lake Walden

will host the 2-day Commercial Underwriters Harbour Pointe Open on June 25 and 26. The Tour's only 36hole, stroke-play tournament is the 2nd major of the year.

• The Match Play Championship will play on the Woodlands of Van Buren for a 2nd consecutive year and 5th time overall on the final weekend in July.

• Saturday, August 27th, will be "Division Championship" day. The Tour is returning to the original plan of having the division championships on the same day. Players that qualify for more than one of the division championships will have to make a choice.

The PLAYERS Championship is

scheduled for a return trip to the Golden Fox - host course for the 2004 PLAYERS. The WESTERN Championship returns to the Coyote Preserve GC - host course for the 2007 WESTERN. And, the 2nd EASTERN Championship is planned for the Orchards GC.

• The TOUR Championship will conclude it's 3-year run at Polo Fields G&CC on September 17. The season finale of tournament stroke-play will invite the top-20 on the overall money list to participate.

• The 7th Commissioner's Cup will take the Tour outside of Michigan borders for the first time, as the matches will be hosted by Maumee State Park in Oregon, Ohio.

Meland hosts 17th Memorial

Green Towels hang in founder's home, but never for long

The golf room at the Meland home is adorned with golf memorabilia of all kinds, including those from professional players from the PGA, Champions and LPGA Tours.

There are items from the 2004 Ryder Cup and the 2008 PGA Championship, both played at Oakland Hills Country Club in Bloomfield Hills. There are also autographs of Ray Floyd, Ben Crenshaw and Larry Nelson, obtained in person, from a Senior PLAYERS Championship when the tournament was held at the TPC of Michigan.

A Tiger Woods autographed Upper Deck trading card probably holds the highest value in the collection. His autographs seem to be holding their value - even after his personal improprieties.

And then there is the Mulligan Tour memorabilia. Autographed hats from the winning Commissioner's Cup teams from 2006, '07, and '08 are on display.

And, of course, the Green Towels.

As the tournament host of the Mulligan Tour's Memorial Tournament, Erik Meland commissions the Green Towels adorned with the tournament logo and the year. Each winter the towels hang on the wall awaiting their unveiling in late May.

And, so far, each year Meland has presented the towels to other players that have prevailed at the Memorial.

The 2011 event is the 17th Memorial Tournament hosted by Meland. The first, in 1995, was an individual, 18-hole gross score tournament. Meland won that inaugural event, a late August affair, with a 20-over par 91.

The format was changed in 1996 to a 2-player scramble and the Green Towels were first introduced in 1998 with towels made retroactively for the '96 and '97 champs. But Meland did not make a towel for his inaugural win - hoping instead to earn one under the new format.

The Memorial Tournament was brought into the fold of the year-old Mulligan Tour in 2000 and became the first grand-slam event of the Tour season starting in 2001 when the tournament moved to May

Meland will team with wife Sue for the 13th time in 2011 and try once again to earn the Green Towels that would finally make a permanent home in the golf room. But the competition is always tough.

Gateway GC will host the Memorial for the 6th time on May 21st. And, the 2011 Green Towels are ready to be awarded to the team with the lowest score.

The 7th Commissioner's Cup matches go green

The Commissioner's Cup team matches started in 2005 when the Tour created 2 regional divisions - the Central and the West. With the addition of the East division last year, the PAC (Player Advisory Council) agreed this past winter to begin rotating the matches among the 3 divisions. Starting in 2011, the winning Comm Cup team will defend the Cup against a team from the division that did not participate the year before.

Thus, the 2011 matches, scheduled for September 24-25 at Maumee Bay State Park east of Toledo, will feature the defending champs, a team representing the Central Division, competing against a team from the East. For the first time, the "green" division will form a team to compete in the annual Commissioner's Cup. East Division Commissioner Tom Hoelzle, a veteran of 5 Comm Cup teams, is looking forward to the opportunity.

This new formula is expected to continue, meaning the winning team in 2011 will make a team in 2012 and defend the Cup against a team representing the West division that sat out in 2011. The 2012 matches are planned for a trip to Forest Dunes GC in northern Michigan.

Backspin From the Mulligan Tour archives

Another Memorial Tournament played in wet conditions was no surprise. Erik Meland's Memorial had been plagued with rain over the years and he had even succumbed to moving his tournament from Willow Metropark, the host course from 1995 to 2005, to Gateway GC after one too many washouts.

The 13th playing for the Green Towels in 2007 was met with familiar, if not frustrating, sogginess. Rainfall continually came and went but Gateway remained playable with some casual water drops along the way.

And so it was unlikely to find the Jeff Klipa / Victor McCoy team at the top of the leaderboard - the two were well known for their dislike of wet golf.

Klipa and McCoy had joined the Tour in 2003 and quickly became good friends. They partnered in the '03 Memorial and finished 5th. They followed that effort with a T5 in '04 and a T3 in '06.

In their 5th attempt for the Green Towels, the pair maneuvered around Gateway avoiding the brunt of the downpours and taking what the course would give. They recorded 5 birdies against a lone bogey to lead a veteran field.

The shot of the tournament came at #14 when Klipa chipped-in from behind the green for a birdie 2 that provided a cushion over the field.

Among the closest pursuers were the '02 champs, Jim Cwikla and Chris Drake, and the '05 champs, Tom Litzler and son. But no other team could get into red numbers.

Having won the Sweet Sixteen earlier in the season, Klipa would go on to win the Harbour Pointe Open and the Quad-Tour Challenge in 2007 for a 4-win season.
