Halfway to the Slam

Thom Bales shoots 65-70 to win 2nd major title of the year

Lakes of Taylor GC, Taylor, MI -

Thom Bales won the 2010 Commercial Underwriters Harbour Pointe Open on June 27th by posting rounds of 65 and 70 for a total of 9-under par 135. He nearly lapped the field with a winning margin of 13 strokes. It was the first HPO to require 2 rounds of total net stroke play over 2 days.

Bales won the Memorial Tournament in May (with partner Mike Prieskorn) and became the 3rd player to win the first 2 majors of the year joining Rick Persichetti in 2004 and Jeff Klipa in 2007.

Bales also won the 2008 HPO played at Eagle Crest GC finishing 18-holes in even par 72. He is the 2nd player to win the HPO twice and became the 7th player in Tour history with at least 3 major titles on his resume.

With an opening round scorecard that included 9 birdies and an eagle, Bales established a 3-stroke lead going into the HPO's first ever "championship round". If not for the challenges of the Lakes of Taylor, it would have been a foregone conclusion that Bales would cruise to victory.

Only 3 other players could break par in Saturday's open round. Rookie

Dennis LeMaitre posted a 4-under 68 and Don Morris and Joe Robar netted 1-under 71's to earn a spot in Sunday's final group. In all, 17 players made the cut at 7-over 79 and all 17 players committed to Sunday's championship round.

As the final 18 holes unfolded, and with the players playing in reverse order of their standings, no one from the early groups could mount a charge.

Rick Persichetti, the 2004 HPO champ, carded 4 birdies and an eagle in the first 8 holes but cooled on the

back nine. Lou Acosta rebounded from a couple of early bogies to get to 1-under for the tournament but could get no closer. He would finish at 4-over par 148 to take solo 2nd place. Persichetti would finish in a tie for 4th after a disastrous quadruple bogey at the Lakes' signature par-3 17th.

Playing in the final group, Bales did open with a bogey on the first hole and another bogey on the tough par-3 3rd. But if he left the door open to start the round, he closed it shut on the Lakes' 3 consecutive par-5's.

Bales carded birdies on 8, 9 and 10 to reach 10-under par for the championship and a 9-stroke lead with 8 holes remaining. He played the long holes well both days going 6 -under on the par-5's and 7-under on the par-4's while going 4-over on the tough par-3's.

Meanwhile, Bales' nearest pursuer lost 6 strokes to par in his first 6 holes. LeMaitre regrouped with birdies at 7, 9 and 10 but by then it was too late to catch Bales. Playing in his first individual major, LeMaitre finished in 3rd place at 5-over 149.

Robar played the front nine in 1over par but a back nine 42 relegated him to a share of 4th place. And Morris had 1 birdie all day and slipped back to T10 with a final round 82.

Young Tom Litzler shot a pair of 75's and John Powell shot 74-76 to be included in the 4-way tie for 4th.

Under the new 2-day format, the \$235 purse extended prize money to the top-16 places. The earnings are recorded on the Tour's overall money standings.

With 3 wins this year - he also won the Par-54 Classic - Bales moved up to 2nd on the money list. His \$110 is \$17 short of the current money leader Greg Kline.

The HPO continued it's long tradition of supporting various charities. This year the Tour raised \$465 for the Lennon Pregnancy Center of Dearborn Heights through the sale of raffle tickets, extra mulligans and a 50/50 putting contest.

Double JJ Ranch hosts 6th Commissioner's Cup matches

The Mulligan Tour LLC, Belleville, MI -

The Commissioner's Cup debuted at the end of the 2005 season as the Mulligan Tour's first foray into team play. There was no money to play for and competitors became teammates - if only for a weekend.

The first Comm Cup was held at the Lakes of Taylor GC in October of '05 and was immediately deemed a success to those who participated even though the Central won convincingly 16 to 8.

The 2006 Cup saw more bonding among the players as they travelled to the Legacy and stayed overnight in lodging at the course.

Travel became even more pronounced in 2007 and 2008 as the players drove 3 hours west to Manistee National in '07 and 3 hours north to Lakewood Shores Resort in '08. Those matches would also produce the most suspense as the outcome was only decided on the 18th hole of the final singles match both years.

Last year's matches were played at Buck's Run GC in Mt. Pleasant. And, although the score was lopsided, the course was a winner with the players. (The casino was also a winner, but we digress!)

The 6th edition of the Commissioner's Cup will take the players back to the west side. The Thoroughbred GC at the Double JJ Ranch will host the matches on September 25-26. The resort, located in Rothbury, just north of Muskegon, also includes a horse ranch and an indoor waterpark.

This year's matches will follow the same format of the past 2 years, where all 4 of the 9-hole team matches will conclude in the first day and the 8 singles matches will be showcased in the final day. With a

total of 24 matches, Team Central needs 12 points to retain the Cup and Team West needs 12 ½ points to win the Cup.

The Thoroughbred is a par 72 layout that will play 5,960 yards long for the men and 4,879 yards for the ladies.

Members can automatically qualify for one of the Comm Cup teams by ranking in the top-7 of the Central or West money standings after the division championships.

If any members decline, then the 8th, 9th and 10th ranked players will be invited. If the teams are still not secured, then the Commissioner's will make "captain's picks" from any interested members to complete the teams.

The registration deadline for qualified players is August 29 and the \$310 entry fee includes the golf, 2 nights lodging and team shirts.

The lodging will be at the course in the Thoroughbred Suites - either 1 or 2 suites per team. A Friday afternoon practice round will probably be scheduled for those interested in getting an advanced look at the course before the competition.

Return to the Woodlands

Sixteen players vie for Match Play Championship at end of July

The Mulligan Tour LLC, Belleville, MI -

The 2010 Match Play Championship, the 3rd grand slam event of the season, is scheduled for the last weekend in July. The tournament returns to the Woodlands of Van Buren for the first time since 2005.

The Woodlands hosted the inaugural Match Play Championship in 2001 and again in 2003. In 2005, while the first 2 rounds were held on the Links at Whitmore Lake, the semi-finals and finals played out at the Woodlands.

The Woodlands presents a classic match play venue with many risk-reward holes on a shorter layout. Target golf is the name of the game at the course that also hosted the 1999 PLAYERS Championship.

All players ranked in the top-16 of the MT World Rankings, as of July 20th, will be invited to participate. With each member that declines their invitation, the tournament will extend invitations down the World Rankings to secure a field of 16 players.

The registration deadline to enter the Championship is July 20. The entry fee of \$110 includes all 4 rounds of golf for the players that advance. Participants that lose in the first round will be credited with \$85 and players that lose in round 2 will be credited \$50.

The first round will start at 2:00pm on Friday, July 30, with the #1 seed playing the #16 seed, the #2 seed playing the #15 seed, and so on. The 8 winners will advance to play on Saturday, July 30, with tee times starting at 1:00pm.

The 4 players that advance past round 2 will play semi-final matches on Sunday morning and either a final

or 3rd place match in the afternoon.

The winner earns a \$60 payday and the runner-up earns \$40. The 3rd place winner will get \$25 while 4th place is worth \$15. Second round losses will also earn \$5 in official prize money for a tie for 5th place.

Questions loom for the Tour's #1. player David Martin. His tournament schedule has been severely limited this year by an inconvenient work schedule. He did get a chance to play in the two Strategic Fox events in June, winning the Fox Hunt and finishing T6 at the Par-54.

And another top player also may not join the field. A new job for the reigning champ, Kelly Arnold, may keep him out. Arnold has not been able play in any tournament since the Sweet Sixteen in mid May.

Han Kim edges out Greg Kline in US Open Best Ball Challenge

Mulligan Tour rookie Han Kim won the MT group of the ESPN On line Fanatsy Game "US Open Best Ball Challenge" on June 20th. He was awarded a sleeve of Titleist ProV1's for the effort.

Kim stayed with the foursome of Phil Mickelson, Jim Furyk, Tom Watson and Ricky Barnes for all 4 rounds. While the 4 started slowly - 7 under on Thursday's opening round the group did nicely on Friday and Saturday to keep Kim in striking distance of the leader Greg Kline.

Kline was 34-under thru 3 rounds

and slept on a 3-stroke lead over another rookie, Sharon Prew. Kim was 5 strokes back entering the final round.

On Sunday, Kim's foursome mixed their birdies well - only duplicating birdies on one hole - while never taking a bogey in the best ball format. His final round 62 left him at 38-under par for the 72 holes. Kline's final round 68 left him a stroke back at 37-under.

The Tour will sponsor similar challenges when ESPN.com conducts the same best ball games for the British Open and the PGA Championship in July and August.

From the Mulligan Tour archives

Greg Kline, master of the mano-a-mano format, wins 3rd straight MT Match Play Championship

August 12, 2006

The Mulligan Tour Match Play Championship was introduced in 2001 and was almost immediately accepted as one of the Tour's major tournaments.

The traditional golf format of match play requires players to take on other players in heads up, hole by hole scoring where the rest of the field matters not. Win against your immediate opponent - and you continue to the next match.

Greg Kline had joined the Tour in 2002 and his first attempt at the Match Play brought him to the title match, but he succumbed to the Tour's #1 player - David Martin in a 2&1 final. Martin would beat Kline again in the opening round of the 2003 tournament before Kline started an unprecedented streak.


Kline ran off 3 straight matches in the 2004 Match Play to win his first major championship. He continued in 2005 winning 4 consecutive matches as the tournament expanded to 12 players.

As the 2006 Match Play approached, Kline was confident of continuing his streak. Now a veteran of 5 seasons and with 9 wins on his resume, Kline earned a first round bye in the '06 tournament. After winning his opening match against Thom Bales, Kline faced his match play nemesis in the tournament's semi-final match.

Kline beat Martin 6&4 to avenge the losses in '02 and '03. He went on to beat the tournament's Cinderella story, Dan Schwartz, 3&2 in the final for his 10th straight win in match play and a 3rd straight Match Play title.

The streak would end in the 2nd round of the '07 tournament when the top-seeded Kline, with a bye through the first round, ran into a buzz saw named Bob Bruning. Playing a gross 4-over par thru 15 holes, Bruning beat Kline 4&3 to bring down the "Master of Match Play".

Kline has amassed a career 20-6 record in the match play format when including his 5-0 record in singles matches in the Commissioner's Cup.
